

<p>1</p> <p>PAR 4</p>		<p>Tee shot needs to favor right center of fairway to avoid fairway bunker left. Approach shot to elevated green may require one more club.</p>
<p>2</p> <p>PAR 3</p>		<p>Downhill tee shot to a very deep green. Yardage plays shorter due to elevation change.</p>
<p>3</p> <p>PAR 4</p>		<p>Tee shot should favor left side of fairway for best approach to this green.</p>
<p>4</p> <p>PAR 5</p>		<p>Double dogleg hole requires a solid tee shot to clear the wetlands. Second shot needs to favor left side for best approach to the green.</p>
<p>5</p> <p>PAR 4</p>		<p>Position hole. Tee shot needs to favor right side of fairway for best approach to green.</p>
<p>6</p> <p>PAR 3</p>		<p>Uphill tee shot over wetlands. Use one more club. Watch for upper hole location on second green. Yardage increases.</p>
<p>7</p> <p>PAR 4</p>		<p>This dogleg right hole plays downhill. Tee shot should favor left side of fairway. From grey tees, big hitters can carry trees for short approach.</p>
<p>8</p> <p>PAR 5</p>		<p>Straight away tee shot should favor left side of fairway. Approach shot is uphill to a green protected by bunkers left and in front, so use one more club.</p>
<p>9</p> <p>PAR 4</p>		<p>Downhill hole that offers a good birdie chance.</p>



RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All **USGA** rules shall apply except where modified by the following local rules.
2. Flag position - Front: Red, Middle: White, Back: Blue
3. All yardages are measured to the center of the green.
4. Collared shirts are required. No cut-offs or tank tops.
5. Return golf carts to path when you reach yellow ropes that front the greens.
6. Please keep pace with the group in front of you.

10 Another short birdie hole. Get it here as you begin the "Best Finish in Michigan Golf".

PAR 4

11 Tee shot from elevated tee. Second shot needs to favor left side to avoid water hazard.

PAR 5

12 Slight uphill tee shot may require one more club. Green is well protected by bunkers.

PAR 3

13 Great golf hole. From elevated tee you can see far & wide. Tee shot needs to favor left side. Approach to big green that is guarded by water right and bunkers left.

PAR 4

14 Straight away hole that has water right and left. Approach to a deep green that is guarded by water left and bunkers right.

PAR 4

15 Longest hole on the golf course plays slightly uphill. Fairway is guarded by trees from 200 yards away.

PAR 5

16 The start of the quarry holes. The island type hole plays downhill over water. A beautiful golf hole.

PAR 3

17 This wrap around hole features a terraced fairway. Tee shot should favor left side as fairway slopes right. Approach shot to uphill green requires one more club.

PAR 4

18 A great finishing hole. Tee shot is played to a ledged fairway. Approach shot is played downhill to a green that is protected by water. Long is better than short.
